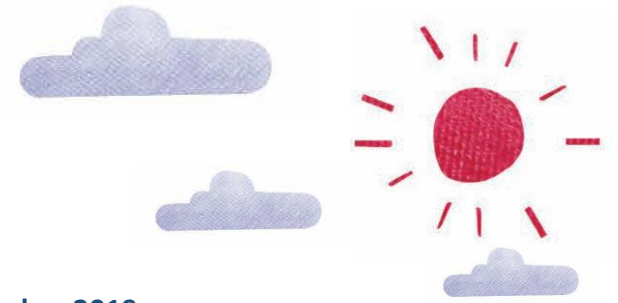




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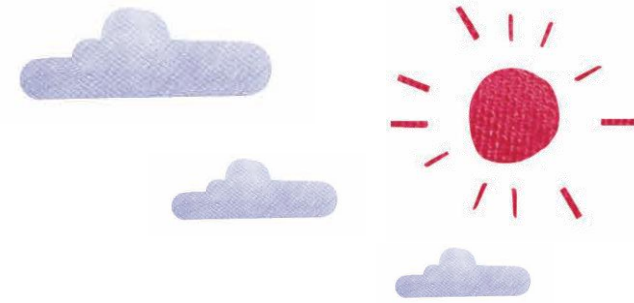

01/04/2019	To fund the ASBIT case management system	Approval required to continue the funding for the ASBIT case management system used by police and local authorities. The PCC pays the annual support and maintenance cost for seven community safety partnerships in the sum of £25,770.55.	Approved subject to further review
01/04/2019	To fund a place at the Police Governance Summit 2019	The Police Governance Summit takes place on Wednesday 3 rd July in Daventry. It is hosted by CoPaCC, the Police Governance experts. It includes sessions run and informed by leading national authorities and subject matter experts. We will also be awarded with our Transparency Award.	Approved



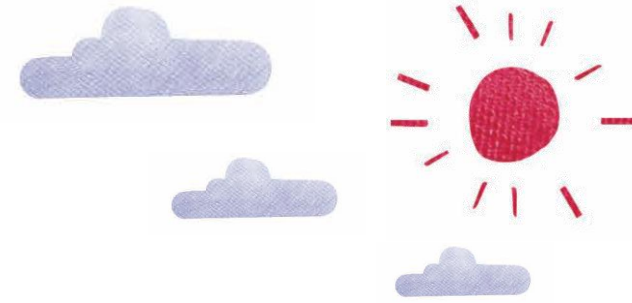

01/04/2019	Attendance at Cardiff Multicultural Mela	The Cardiff Multicultural Mela provides an excellent opportunity to engage with members of the public and increase our visibility. Support is required for a package for our attendance which includes sponsor branding, backstage passes, product promotion, photography rights and media coverage	Approved
01/04/2019	KESS Academic Research- evaluation of partnership working across Wales	The proposed academic research undertaken by Swansea University under the Knowledge, Economy, Skills, Scholarship, and in particular to assess the impact of initiatives such as Dyfodol on a public health policing approach. The Commissioner is asked for a contribution of £4500 to undertake this work.	Approved



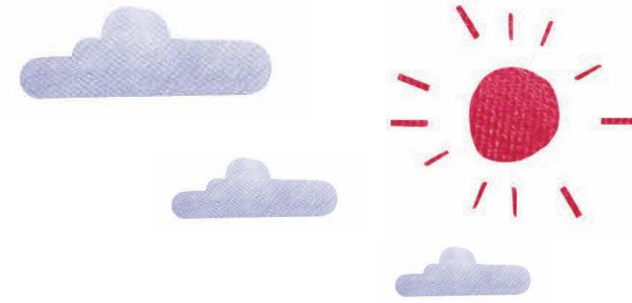


08/04/2019	IDVA/ISVA Funding	To give an award of £111,757.50 from the victim services budget to fund IDVA/ISVA provision in the South Wales area after a stringent application process.	Approved
11/04/2019	Leasing of a Unit on Bridgend Industrial Estate for a tactical training facility	It is a pressing requirement that suitable premises are found for firearms training as there has been an exponential increase in the training required due to the increased requirement for firearms officers in a variety of operational circumstances. A dedicated unit is required with the monies coming from the Joint Firearms Unit Budget.	Approved
13/06/2019	Sponsorship for the National LGBT Policing Conference	To provide £2,500 towards the National LGBT Policing Conference, which was entirely organised by the Wales LGBT police network. It is the first time the annual conference has come to Wales. The Commissioner's logo will be prevalent across the conference.	Approved
17/06/2019	To provide support and commitment (including financial) for the Drive Project	The Drive Project codifies, tests and replicates a preventative response to high risk perpetrators. A financial commitment of £270,000 will be provided to ensure that the service continues to be provided throughout 2019-20.	Approved



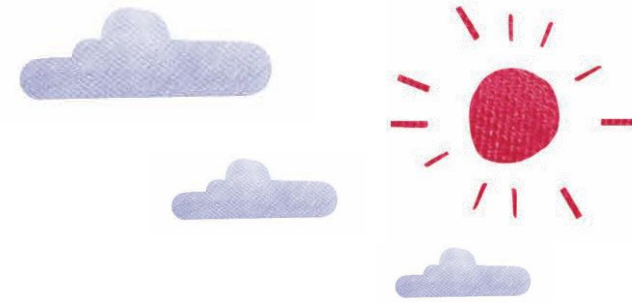


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17/06/2019	Transfer of police property funds to the youth trust	To transfer £100,000 of the Police Property Fund money to the Youth Trust to further its work and encourage payroll giving.	Approved
01/07/2019	ASBIT Future Options	For changes to be made to the case management system used for monitoring cases of Anti-Social behaviour for the future sustainability of the ASB data which ASBIT currently holds, which will become obsolete. Cost implication would be £4,400 plus VAT to be taken from the Community Safety Fund.	Approved
03/07/2019	Request for exemption from the tender procedure to purchase Programme Management services to support NOMADS programme and approval to engage the services of Farsight Solutions Ltd	In December 2018, the NOMAD programme was awarded a grant of £472,000 from the police transformation fund with a requirement to deliver the proposed outputs by March 2019. There was a need to swiftly engage a consultant service to deliver the outputs which left an insufficient time to undertake a competitive tendering process.	Approved



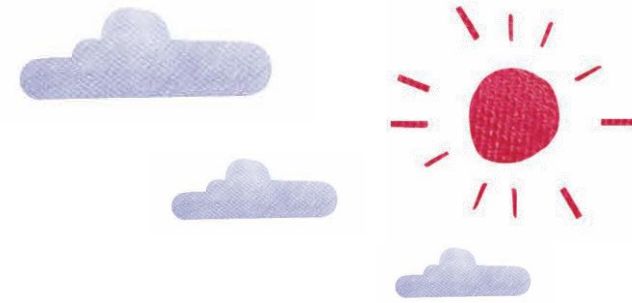


24/07/2019	To provide a contribution of £1000 towards the Butetown Carnival	To provide financial support towards the organisation of the Butetown Carnival, with the goal of bringing people together and celebrate the inclusivity and diversity of the community.	Approved
29/07/2019	Contribution towards the Central Beacons Mountain Rescue Team for a secure storage and room within the Fire Service Premises	A fire in 2017 destroyed much of the base of the Brecon Beacons Mountain Rescue and as such they required assistance in rebuilding.	Approved- Commissioner commented "the team works closely with South Wales Police and provides an invaluable voluntary public service, and the contribution reflects the value to the police service".
15/08/2019	Request to initially fund the launch of the IRIS project in the Neath and Port Talbot Area at a cost of £50,000	Funding should be superseded by other streams in the Autumn and a formal bid is currently being submitted to cover the running costs of IRIS in this area.	Approved- on the basis that the earliest possible start is required.





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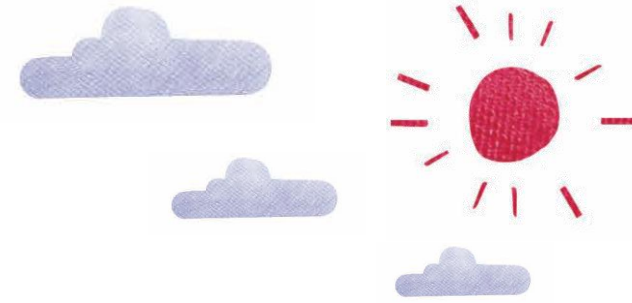


15/08/2019	Request for exemption from tender procedure to secure London Metropole University to carry out an evaluation of the 'Change that Lasts' model	An evaluation of the Change that Lasts model is required as part of the Home Office Violence Against Women and Girls service transformation fund in 2017. Due to capacity issues Public Health Wales was unable to carry out the evaluation as required. As there was not enough time to conduct a proper tender process expressions of interest were circulated to 5 organisations and this one provided the best value for money at a cost of around £58,000 from the VAWG budget.	Approved
04/09/2019	Request for financial support of £500 to support a cohesion event	The British Championship Football Tournament made up of 8 teams is being held in Cardiff. The purpose of the tournament is to tackle some of the serious violence involving young people from BAME backgrounds and how the power and unique appeal of football can help to address this ongoing concern.	Approved





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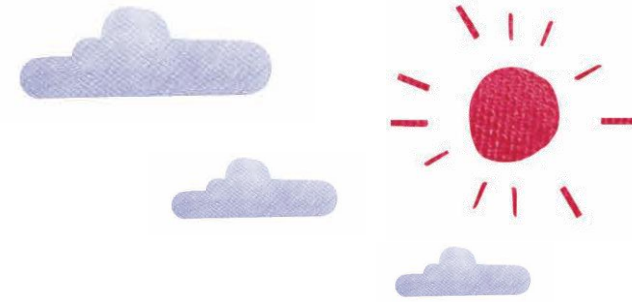


04/09/2019	Acquisition of property for use as a taser training facility	The Chief Constable has committed to increase the number of staff trained to carry taser and this will result in the requirement to expand the taser training facility in the force. A warehouse facility in Bridgend has been sourced at the cost of £24,150 a year which will be funded from the knife crime budget. Approval is requested to commit to a 5-year lease.	Approved
04/09/2019	Request for funding for a VAWG 2019-24 phase 2 strategy launch and round table event	Tackling VAWG strategy has been circulated to partners as a soft launch, phase 2 launch is now required to focus on early intervention and prevention. Launch would include a conference room hire, buffet, and provision of literature and speakers, at a cost of £2500	Approved
30/09/2019	Request for support for the Stephen Lawrence Bursary	The APCC and National Black Police Association has asked all Commissioners to contribute to a Stephen Lawrence bursary. This will provide a placement for BME officers to study in the USA for a period of time with the aim of fostering relations with communities and bringing back learning at the cost of £1700. 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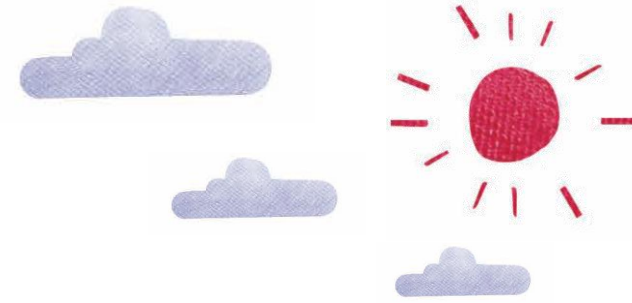

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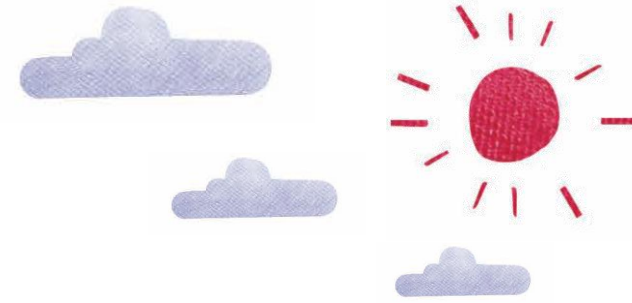

17/12/2019	Survivor Empowerment	Within the Tackling Violence Against Women and Girls Strategy 2019-2024 we have stated that we will continue to target resources towards clear routes to safety for victims, supporting and empowering survivors and investing in evidence-based interventions that tackle root causes, addressing the harmful attitudes and behaviours that result in violence and abuse. Request for £30,000 funding to support this work.	Approved
18/12/2019	Family Interventions	A family Interventions programme is currently run by Safer Merthyr Tydfil funded through our office and the Violence Against Women and Girls Service Transformation Fund until March 2020. This	Approved





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		programme looks at families who are experiencing domestic abuse and wish to remain living together, able to access support for them and to do so safely or be supported to separate amicably. Request for £80,000 funding to extend this programme into the financial year 2020-21.	
20/12/2019	National Offender Management Multi-Agency Data Sharing (NOMADS) Bridging Funding	The National Offender Management Multi-Agency Data Sharing (NOMADS) project has attracted significant interest from a broad range of partner agencies within Wales, including Welsh Government. Wales is particularly well placed to maximise the opportunities presented by NOMADS through its existing investment in initiatives such as The Welsh Community Care Information System (WCCIS). Request to secure £30,000 additional funding for a piece of work to map the synergies between the two initiatives and incorporate both going forward.	Approved
